All these new believers are together all the time, and some of us don't have very much. So we all started selling our stuff and giving to anyone who needs anything. And the Lord keeps adding to our number daily. And we gladly share our food and our homes. This is a very exciting time to be in Jerusalem. I hope it will be like this forever!

**Carnival Barker:** Look at how happy all these new Christians are. Look at them hug each other and high five each other and clap each other on the back. They share and give and praise God and smile and laugh and talk. They encourage one another every day. Don't you want to be part of a group like this forever? When these new believers encourage me, I want to encourage them. Hey, here they come to share all their stuff with us!

Child: I want to share, too!

**Carnival Barker:** I knew you were getting into the spirit of it! Peanuts! Get your peanuts right here!

# The Unknown God (WEEK 13)

### Cast of voices: Narrator One **Narrator Two**

**Narrator One:** Welcome to the *Armchair Traveler*, the firstclass show about how to travel on a third-class budget. Today we'll take a tour of Athens. Greece!

**Narrator Two:** Athens—one of the most *beautiful* cities in the world. Filled with temples, filled with art, filled with...

Narrator One: Idols.

Narrator Two: Umm...pardon?

**Narrator One:** Athens is filled with idols. You see, the people who live here believe there are many, many gods, and different people worship different ones. You can see some of the gods there on that busy street.

**Narrator Two:** Those statues are *gods*?

**Narrator One:** Actually, they're idols built to the gods, and people pick out the ones they want to worship. The one on the far left is Humidity, the god of hot, sweaty days. See how he's slumped over because he's so hot? How his tongue is sticking out because he's been panting? And how tired and sweaty and *nasty* he looks?

**Narrator Two:** Why would someone worship Humidity? **Narrator One:** Beats me. The next idol to Humidity is *much* more popular. That's Sylvania, the goddess of light. See how her right hand is stretching out toward the sun? And her left hand is stretching out toward the moon?

**Narrator Two:** Why does she have such a pained expression on her face, like something is hurting her?

**Narrator One:** That's because she's also the goddess of *firelight*, so she's standing on hot coals.

**Narrator Two:** *That's* gotta hurt.

**Narrator One:** The next idol is Lottarinia, the goddess of good luck. You'll notice that she's all chipped and nicked and standing sort of crooked—leaning to the right?

Narrator Two: Yeah, what's with that?

**Narrator One:** People believe that carrying a piece of Lottarinia brings good luck, so they've chiseled off most of the marble base the idol is built on. People take the chips to sporting events and other places where they make bets.

**Narrator Two:** So being the goddess of good luck hasn't been so lucky for Lottarinia?

**Narrator One:** Nope. And the last idol is someone *really* special. **Narrator Two:** You mean that plain statue that guy is looking at

so closely? It doesn't *look* all that special...

**Narrator One:** Ah, but that's the idol built to the *unknown* god! Athenians don't want to accidentally leave a god out, so they built an extra idol—just in case.

**Narrator Two:** The guy standing next to the idol...he's turning to face the crowd on the street. He's starting to say something, and people are actually *listening*. Look at how he's pointing to the idol of the unknown god, and then pointing to the crowd.

**Narrator One:** He says he knows who this "unknown god" is... that this god doesn't live in temples and he's not carved out of stone, gold, or silver.

**Narrator Two:** He's saying that there's a *real* God—and that the *real* God wants us to guit doing bad things and come to him in faith.

**Narrator One:** And that real God *proved* he's the real God by raising Jesus from the dead! Wow! That's big news! Listen to how the crowd is responding! They *love* this guy! Who is he, by the way?

**Narrator Two:** I think it's the Apostle Paul.

**Narrator One:** Well, the crowd is asking him to go to Areopagus so he can share his new idea with an even *bigger* crowd. And Paul is doing it—he's walking off with the crowd!

**Narrator Two:** We should go with them.

**Narrator One:** Great idea, but that's all the time we have today. Thanks for joining us here on the *Armchair Traveler*, and for both of us I want to wish you happy trails everywhere you go. But before we go, let's give a hand for all our outstanding actors!


